FNTS President Kim Whittaker has been with FNTS since 1996 and now leads the company as its first female president, paving the way for women in technology.

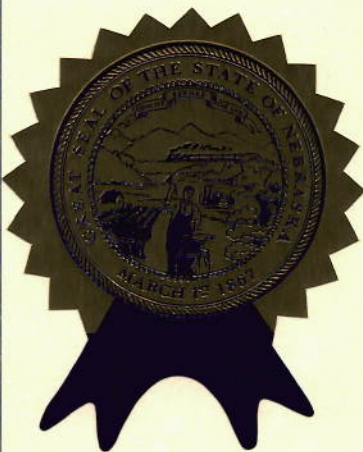
NOW, THEREFORE,
